Entry Requirements

After mooring, yachts must visit the Immigration and Customs offices ashore. Immigration is located on the 5th floor of the State Warehouse near to the Cape Town International Conference Centre on the Waterfront.

The Customs office is located at 22 Hans Strijdom Avenue (use the entrance on the corner of Long Avenue). A taxi may be the best option from both RCYC or V&A Waterfront.

General

Cape Town, the gateway to South Africa, is one of the most evocative cities in the world thanks to its unique position at the tip of Africa separating the Atlantic and Indian oceans; its varied colonial history and its position close to the region's best wineries.

Cape Town provides the setting for many scenic wonders, from mountainous views to sandy beaches, colonial farmsteads and buzzing urban nightlife, there is something for everyone. And, as the home to South African sports from football to rugby and cricket, there is always some top-class sport to experience and cheer along to.

With a huge area of the city set to receive visitors the nightlife is a vibrant and enjoyable experience. Every type of live music is available from dance and European styles through to Zulu and Xhosa music.

Cape Town is a city of culture, built on a history that reflects in the architecture, cuisine, music and dance. Together with a warm summer and temperate winter climate and a friendly community, the Western Cape and the Mother City are an ideal destination throughout the year.

Don't Miss

Two Oceans Aquarium: With the aquatic mix of two oceans meeting close by, the underwater life is very varied.

Table Mountain Cable Car: The exhilarating ascent of Table Mountain in the cable car is a definite must for any visitor. Even the locals are awed time and again by the 360° view of Cape Town. The cable car was first opened in 1929 and today conveys some 600,000 people to the summit annually. On the summit there is a restaurant and a souvenir shop, from which letters bearing the Table Mountain postmark can be sent. Short walks from the cable station take visitors through the splendour of the flora of Table Mountain, framed by the surrounding azure of the Atlantic Ocean. Cheaper entry to the cable car is available after 1800, or walk up for free.

Robben Island: Named after the seals that congregate there and an amazing place to see Great White sharks. Also famous as both a leper colony and later the prison that Nelson Mandela was held in for twenty-five years.

Mooring

There are two main mooring options in Cape Town:

1. Royal Cape Yacht Club (RCYC) marina, located in the south eastern corner of the commercial port. Facilities include a boatyard, chandlery, showers, restaurants and bars.
